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

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

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LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

AB 2104 (Soria): Community colleges: Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing Pilot Program

This bill would authorize 15 community college districts to offer a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree. The Chancellor would identify eligible community college districts based on specified criteria, including: • (A) Districts that demonstrate equitable access to the pilot program, with a focus on regions showing a need for healthcare professionals. This includes regions with a projected significant growth rate above 7% over the years 2025 to 2030 and regions encompassing northern, central, and southern parts of the state. • (B) Districts located in underserved nursing areas. • (C) Districts where the service area includes communities with persistent poverty.

Location: Assembly Higher Education Committee, April 16th Hearing

League Position: SUPPORT

AB 1818 (Jackson): Homeless Students: Parking

This bill requires each CCC, CSU, and UC campus to allow overnight parking by a homeless student attending its campus if the student uses the vehicle as housing and has a valid parking permit. Prohibits each campus from citing or penalizing the student. *This policy proposal is similar to AB 302 (Berman, 2019). AB 302's cost estimate for the CCC: \$500,000/campus; \$36 million total

Location: Assembly Higher Education Committee, April 16th Hearing

League Position: OPPOSE

AB 359 (Holden): College and Career Access Pathways Partnerships

This bill among other provisions, would authorize a community college district to enter into a CCAP partnership outside of its service area if the local college district has denied a request to establish a CCAP partnership. Removes the requirement for a high school principal to individually recommend students to participate in dual enrollment courses. Allows courses to be offered in a synchronous or asynchronous online format.

Location: Senate Rules Committee

SB 1244 (Newman) Pupil instruction: dual enrollment: College and Career Access Pathways partnerships

This bill would authorize a community college district to enter into a CCAP partnership to offer dual enrollment courses with a school district, county office of education, or charter school within the service area of another community college district if the community college district in the service area has declined a request from, or has failed to take action within 60 calendar days of a request to either enter into a CCAP partnership or to approve another community college district to enter into a CCAP partnership to offer those courses.

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LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

SB 995 (Padilla): High-Quality Teacher Recruitment and Retention Act

The bill would require the Chancellor of the California State University to create a 5-year pilot program starting in the 2025–26 school year. This program would aim to recruit high-quality teaching candidates at three CSU campuses in partnership with three community college campuses. The pilot program must meet specific requirements, including establishing a transfer model curriculum and an associate degree for transfer at a community college. This degree could then be completed at a CSU campus, resulting in the student earning a bachelor's degree and a teaching credential in four years.

Location: Senate Appropriations Committee

SB 1015 (Cortese): Nursing Schools and Programs

This bill would require the Nursing Education and Workforce Advisory Committee to study specified topics and to submit a report making recommendations to the Legislature regarding how approved schools of nursing or nursing programs should manage or coordinate clinical placements.

AB 2608 (Gabriel): Postsecondary education: sexual violence and sexual harassment training:

This bill requires all higher education institutions to update their annual sexual violence and sexual harassment training for students. • To include additional topics, including how to recognize if someone is at risk of drug-facilitated sexual assault.

Location: Assembly Higher Education Committee, April 16th Hearing

SB 1166 (Dodd): Public postsecondary education: annual report: sex discrimination.

- Requires the governing board of each district to report to the Chancellor's office on their activities undertaken by the community college district to ensure campus programs and activities are free from sex discrimination.
- The data that is required is extensive and includes the number of complaints received and length of time needed to commence an investigation. It also requires reporting on the number of hearings conducted and the outcomes.
- The Chancellor's office must file this report once a year with the state legislature.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

AB 2326 (Alvarez): Public postsecondary education: sex discrimination policies

- States that it is the joint responsibility of the locally elected board and the CEO of the district that the programs and activities offered by the college are free from discrimination.
- The chancellor's office must annually submit a report to the Board of Governor's that the colleges are discrimination including sexual harassment.
- The President of the Board and Chancellor would be required to present to the Budget subcommittees the annual report.
- This presentation would serve as a certification of that the California Community Colleges are addressing and preventing discrimination system receives state student financial aid.

Location: Assembly Higher Education Committee, April 16th Hearing

AB 2407 (Hart): Public postsecondary educational institutions: sexual harassment complaints: state audits

- Directs the California State Auditor by January 1, 2026, and every 3 years thereafter, to conduct an audit of the California Community Colleges, the California State University, and the University of California regarding their respective handling and investigation of sexual harassment complaints.
- Require the audits to, among other things, evaluate each institution's compliance with applicable federal and state law in cases where the respondent of a sexual harassment complaint is a student, faculty member, or staff member and determine if each institution's policies and procedures regarding sexual harassment are adequate to prevent, detect, and address sexual harassment.
- Will be amended to clarify that multiple colleges will be audited every 3 years forever.

Location: Assembly Higher Education Committee, April 16th Hearing

SB 1491 (Eggman): Disclosures: Equity in Higher Education Act: Title IX: exemptions.

This bill requires the Trustees of the California State University, the University of California, and the governing board of each community college district to designate an employee at each of their respective campuses as a point of contact for the needs of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender faculty, staff, and students.

Location: Senate Judiciary Committee, April 16th Hearing
