- LIBERTY OF FOCUSING ON ONE OR FEW INDIVIDUAL TOPICS; IN NURSING, EVERYTHING IS INCLUDED IN THE STUDY
 - THEORY, NURSING SKILLS,
 PHARMACOLOGY, AND CLINICALS

WORK

- WHILE IN THE PROGRAM, STUDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO PRIORITIZE THEIR TIME OUTSIDE OF THE CLASSROOM TO ALLOW FOR UNINTERRUPTED STUDY PERIODS.
 SOME EMPLOYERS WILL WORK WITH YOU.



COST OF EDUCATION OUTSIDE OF IVC

- •Tuition, fees, books and supplies for **LPN/LVN** training in a state-approved program typically costs **\$5,000-\$25,000** at a public college and **\$20,000-\$40,000** or more at a private school, depending on location, length of program (typically 12-18 months) and state residency status (for public schools).
- •Tuition, fees, books and supplies for an associate degree in nursing (**ADN**) can cost \$6,000-\$40,000 or more at a public college and \$30,000-\$100,000 or more at a private school, depending on location, length, school status, and the student's state of residency (for public schools). Living, transportation and personal expenses will vary.
- •Tuition, fees, books and supplies for a traditional four-year bachelor of science in nursing (**BSN**) typically cost **\$40,000 \$200,000** or more, depending on whether it is a public or private school and its reputation. Tuition, fees, books and supplies for an accelerated BSN program -- for students who have already earned a bachelor's degree in a non-nursing subject -- can cost \$17,000-\$90,000 or more.
- •Diploma programs are the oldest and most traditional nursing education in the United States, and are still offered by a few hospitals. Tuition, fees, books and supplies can cost \$18,000-\$40,000 or more, depending on the hospital, length and location, and \$20,000-\$40,000 or more at a private school, depending on location, length of program (typically 12-18 months) and state residency status (for public schools).

TEAS EXAM — WWW.ATITESTING.COM

TEAS exam Version 7 proctored remotely online by ATI or completed in person at an approved ATI testing location will be accepted. Students interested in taking the exam must register at www.atitesting.com. The exam fee is \$120 and must be paid directly to ATI. All questions or concerns regarding the TEAS exam will need to be directed to ATI's customer service.

All RN and LVN to RN Bridge applicants must pass the TEAS exam with a total score of 62% or higher. Only the first passing score of 62% or higher will be considered for admission in conjunction with the required admission criteria.

TEAS Points:

```
90 - 100\% = 20 \text{ points}
```

70 - 89% = 17 points

62 - 69% = 12 points

61% or less = 0 points

TEAS Retesting Policy –

Students will have two attempts to take TEAS within a 1-year period. If the student does not pass with a total score of 62% on the first attempt, then a four-month waiting period is required. The four-month waiting period will allow students to remediate in areas needing improvement. The Nursing department will accept the score from the second attempt only (within the same version) with the requirement that it is taken after the four months wait period from the first failed test attempt. If a passing score is not achieved after two attempts regardless of where it is was taken, the student can no longer apply to the Registered Nursing Program at Imperial Valley College.

- 'RELEVANT CERTIFICATES' MEANS STATE CERTIFIED CURRENT CERTIFICATES HELD BY STUDENT
- ALLIED HEALTH CERTIFICATIONS, IE EMT, CNA, HHA, CMA
- WORK OR VOLUNTEER EXPERIENCE MUST BE IN A <u>HEALTHCARE</u> <u>SETTING</u> WITHIN THE LAST 3 YEARS.
- EACH AREA MUST BE CLEARLY IDENTIFIED IN THE APPLICATION TO BE CONSIDERED
- REFER TO THE MULTI-CRITERIA GRID

LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

- STUDENTS MUST IDENTIFY PROFICIENCY EITHER BY WRITTEN LETTER FROM EMPLOYER ON COMPANY LETTERHEAD, OR COMPLETION OF APPLICABLE COURSE.
- LETTER MUST VERIFY STUDENT CAN <u>SPEAK</u>, <u>READ</u>, <u>AND WRITE</u> IN A <u>ANOTHER LANGUAGE</u> AND CAN SPEAK, READ, AND WRITE IN A <u>HEALTHCARE SETTING</u>.
- IF COURSE TAKEN <u>OUTSIDE</u> IVC, COPY OF TRANSCRIPT REQUIRED.

 Science BIOL course in Fall or Spring recommended.
- Know when to study for the TEAS Focus on completion of prerequisites first.
- Know the documentation required to apply
- Know your stress level everyone has a tipping point
- Know your financial aid status. Seek assistance, funding sources (like work),
 scholarships, family support, etc. F.A. restrictions are a constant change.
- No rushing through program requirements do your best and work for the top grades.
