IV. PROGRAM UPDATE-AutoCAD Program

A program update was given to the committee for the AutoCAD program. CertiPort industry certification is offered to students and is 50% covered by IVC. We are currently recruiting for an instructor to teach the AutoCAD course.

We will need 6 letters of support to send to the Chancellors office for approval of the AutoCAD program.

Faculty are in the process of getting the forklift and Reach lift equipment certifications.

The committee was asked to bring to the next meeting a list of potential certifications they feel will benefit the students when getting hired.

An applied math course was created for CTE programs and will possibly be added to the program.

V. STRONG WORKFORCE FUNDS

IVC tries to purchase equipment that companies use so students know how to use it when going out into the workforce. We are currently looking into purchasing a mini excavator.

VI. FAST-TRACK

We are currently offering a fast-track option in welding program and are looking to try it for the Building Construction Program. The committee was in agreement that the fast-track option would work for this program.

VII. INDUSTRY INPUT

Industry recommended having a Fire and restoration class, adding a be green to the BLDC 140 course, and add a fire sprinklers course.

VIII.OTHER

CSLB license gives students 2 years of experience after they complete the program.

Genaro mentioned that there are programs for employers that offer different options like paying full wages or reimbursing the employers up to 75%. New program placing students and will cover 50% of the wages.

Efrain informed the committee that Measure B could possibly pass which will allow IVC to renovate the facilities on campus and build a new public safety center and Lithium training center.
