Update: For fall semester 120 DSPS were referred for tutorial services. Currently 70% of the students are still attending and grades will be reviewed in January. Update: For the academic year 2016-2017 a total of 142 students received one to one tutorial services for 187 class subjects. A total of 23 students dropped their classes receiving tutorial services in the 2016-2017 academic year. The drops were due to medical, personal, or academic requirements were too heavy due to number of units student had enrolled in for the semester. Evidence can be found in Starfish counselor notes. A total of 142 unduplicated Students receiving tutorial services completed 123 of their classes with C grade or better in all subjects including basic skills (66.87%). The success rate for both Basic English and Math was 51.89%.

We did not meet the goal of 10 % but did have improvement on the success rate. We will continue to work on improving the success rate of DSPS students. With increased tutorial services and embedded tutors we hope the next year will bring additional increases in the success rate from this year.
