STATE UPDATE: TRAILER BILL

- The Governor's proposed 2018 Budget Trailer Bill released on February 1, includes policy implementation details for Student Centered Funding Formula, as well as, the California Online College and Aligning California Community College Financial Aid.
- The 2018-19 budget proposes \$175 million to transition colleges to a new student-focused funding formula comprised of a base grant, supplemental grant, and a Student Success Incentive Grant.
- **Base Grants (50% of formula)** — District base grants based on FTES enrollment.
- **Supplemental Grant (25% of formula)** — Supplemental grants based on the number of low-income students that the district enrolls reflecting two factors: (1) enrollment of students who receive a College Promise Grant fee waiver (formerly known as the BOG Waiver); and (2) enrollment of students that receive a Pell Grant.
- **Student Success Incentive Grant (25% of formula)** — Additional funding for: 1) the number of degrees and certificates granted; 2) the number of students who complete a degree or certificate in 3 years or less; and 3) funds for each Associate Degree for Transfer granted by the college.
- **Hold Harmless Provision** — During the first year of implementation, districts would be held harmless to 2017-18 levels.
- Extensive review of the proposed funding formula has begun. Chancellor Oakley has tasked a workgroup of CEOs to provide guidance and leadership in the development of a revised funding formula for California's community colleges. STATE UPDATE: BILLS TO WATCH

- Legislators have begun to introduce a wide range of bills for the 2018 session. The deadline to introduce legislation was February 16th. Here are some samples-more to follow.
- **AB 1037 (Limon):** Cal Grant B Service Incentive Grant Program: Currently AB 540 students are ineligible to receive federal financial aid, preventing them from participating in federally funded work study programs. AB 1037 (Limon) would help alleviate this by providing 2,500 grants of up to \$1,500 each to AB 540 students in return for community service.

STATE UPDATE: BILLS TO WATCH *Continued*

- **AB 1935 (Irwin) Community Colleges:** Tutoring Sponsored by the Chancellor's Office and supported by the League, this bill would allow colleges to capture apportionment for providing supervised tutoring for students enrolled in credit classes. Currently colleges can only do this for non-credit students.
- **SB 940 (Beal) Cal Grant Program: Foster Youth:** This bill is intended to strengthen the Cal Grant program for students who are former foster youth. By increasing the amount of financial aid available to former foster youth, the bill will help former foster youth take more classes and be more academically successful. Specifically, it would:
 - Permit former foster youth to qualify as long as they are under the age of 26.
 - Extend the period of time to use a Cal Grant award from five to six years.
 - Permit foster youth community college students who apply for a Cal Grant on the September 2nd deadline to qualify for the Cal Grant entitlement award.
